- 4. Exhibits remain the property of the exhibitor, but the Committee will be grateful to those who kindly donate exhibits for auction. Exhibits that are not to be included in the auction must be clearly marked with red stickers, provided on the day.
- 5. All cups and trophies are perpetual and must be returned one week before the 2017 Annual Show.
- 6. All awards will be at the discretion of the judges.

GUIDANCE ON EXHIBITING

Vegetables, fruit, flowers and domestic

When the schedule specifies more than one in a class, make sure that you have the right number. Entries may otherwise be disqualified. In any competitive entry uniformity is important, and it is better to exhibit same-size smaller specimens than to mix large and small.

Potatoes: should be free of blemishes caused by pests, diseases or rough handling.

Carrots and parsnips: choose straight, unforked roots with a good colour. Avoid those which have turned green near the top. Remove leaves to no more than 3ins/8cm stalk.

Beetroot: should have a good skin colour. When cut, the flesh should be a good red colour free from white markings. Remove leaves to no more than 3ins/8cm stalk.

Runner beans: choose long, straight, smooth, fresh beans. Retain a section of the stem to enhance appearance.

Onions: bulbs should not be skinned excessively, and should have firm, thin necks which may be tied.

Tomatoes: should be ripe but firm, with calyces attached. Avoid fruits which are unripe, overripe, or have green blemishes.

Domestic:

All entries should be covered, and preserves should have a wax disc, and label giving date in full.

Presentation:

Points are awarded for straight labels, clean jars etc., and, with baked items, for attractive presentation on a plate, board, slate etc. as appropriate.

Taste:

All domestic entries will be tasted, and judged on taste as much as presentation.

Fruit scones: fluted cutter, no glaze (can dust with flour), no overcooked fruit on the surface.

Plain scones: plain cutter, no glaze (can dust with flour).

Victoria sandwich: top flat without bubbles or rack marks. Both halves same thickness. Light sprinkling of castor (not icing) sugar.

Photography:

Prints will be attached to the display boards with drawing pins. It is hoped that this can be done without damage, but you may prefer to mount them on card before entering.

Maximum exhibit size (classes 1, 46-52 and 54): entries exceeding the specified size will be disqualified.
